<b>Medi-Cal</b>	Provides medical services for children and adults in low income families who are medically needy or medically indigent.	<b>Families must provide proof of:</b> Income                              Residence Age                                      Property
<b>Child Care</b>	Provides free or almost free child care programs which are available to provide a safe and healthy environment that supports the development and growth of young children.	<b>Families must provide proof of:</b> Residence                              Work or School/Training Child age                              Income

<b>Kinship Care (Kin-GAP)</b>	Provides family support services and payments to relative caregivers and the dependent children placed in their homes by the juvenile court and to those who are at risk of court.	<b>Eligibility based on:</b> Age                                      Deprivation of parents Residency                              due to absence, health, Citizenship                              death or unemployment
